She used oil paints in vibrant, bold colours. Painting the flowers at such a close range makes the viewer see the object in a completely different way.</p>

Select from, arrange and mix a variety of drawing media.</p>	<p>In 1929, O’Keeffe visited New Mexico and was amazed at the landscape; the incredible rock formations, the unusual light, the bones of animals dried out by the sun and the Navajo culture.</p>

<b>Full name</b>	Georgia Totto O’Keeffe
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<b>Born</b>	15th November 1887 in Wisconsin, USA.
<b>Family</b>	One of seven children. Georgia's mother encouraged her interest in art.
<b>Died</b>	6th March 1986 aged 98 years old.
<b>Education</b>	She studied at the Art Institute of Chicago and had her first gallery show in 1916.
<b>Later life</b>	She began to lose her eyesight and in 1972 she painted her last unassisted painting.
