
TOPIC: How Can we Manage Risk in Different Places? YEAR: Four

What should I know already?	What will I know by the end of the unit?
 From Year 2: How rules and restrictions help them to keep safe (e.g. basic road, fire, cycle, water safety; in relation to medicines/ household products and online). How to identify risky and potentially unsafe situations (in familiar and unfamiliar environments, including online) and take steps to avoid or remove themselves from them. How to resist pressure to do something that makes them feel unsafe or uncomfortable, including keeping secrets. How not everything they see online is true or trustworthy and that people can pretend to be someone they are not. How to tell a trusted adult if they are worried for themselves or others, worried that something is unsafe or if they come across something that scares or concerns them. How to cross the road safely. 	 How to recognise, predict, assess and manage risk in different situations How to keep safe in the local environment and less familiar locations (e.g. near rail, water, road; fire/firework safety; sun safety and the safe use of digital devices when out and about) How people can be influenced by their peers' behaviour and by a desire for peer approval; how to manage this influence How people's online actions can impact on other people How to keep safe online, including managing requests for personal information and recognising what is appropriate to share or not share online How to report concerns, including about inappropriate online content and contact That rules, restrictions and laws exist to help people keep safe and how to respond if they become aware of a situation that is anti-social or against the law

Vocabulary				
Road safety	Road safety " means to be aware of the traffic on the roads and the typical things that might occur if you are not familiar with them.			
Water safety	Water safety is about how to keep safe on and around water, where there is a risk of injury or drowning.			

Fire safety	How to prevent fire and what to do if a fire starts and you are near it or in danger.			
Medicines	Medicine is a drug or herb used to maintain health or treat a health issue.			
Risk	Risk is the possibility of something bad happening.			
Protect	Keep safe from harm or injury.			
Dangerous	Likely to cause harm or injury.			
Online safety	Internet safety, or online safety, is the knowledge of user's personal safety against security risks to private information and the self-protection from computer crime in general.			
Peer approval/accepta nce	Peer acceptance is the degree to which a child is socially accepted by peers.oval/acceptaIt includes the level of peer popularity and the ease with which a child can initiate and maintain satisfactory peer relationships.			
Anti social	Contrary to the laws and customs of society, in a way that causes annoyance and disapproval in others.			
Inappropriate content	Not suitable or proper material for a child's age.
